# ANTHONY HOUSEFATHER, MP MOUNT ROYAL Speaker - March 7, 2019

Our speaker on March 7th is Anthony Housefather, MP- Chair of the Commons Standing Committee on Justice and Human Rights. He will be discussing surrogacy and human trafficking.

Mr. Housefather was elected as Member of Parliament for Mount Royal on October 19, 2015. In February 2016, he was elected as Chairman of the Standing Committee on Justice and Human Rights, which has the power to examine and to produce reports on the policies, programs and expenses of the Department of Justice.

Anthony was first elected to office in 1994. He was initially elected as a municipal councilor in Hampstead, then elected in Côte-Saint-Luc/Hampstead/Montreal West, and served as Mayor of Côte-Saint-Luc between 2005 and 2015.

Moreover, Anthony has two Law Degrees (B.C.L. and LL.B.) from McGill University and an MBA from Concordia University's John Molson School of Business. Until he was elected an MP, he served as Executive Vice President Corporate Affairs and General Counsel at Dialogic Corporation.

On a personal level, Anthony participates in numerous activities in his community. He is a member of the drama society and swim team. His performance in swimming earned him seven medals at the 2013 Maccabiah Games, in Israel and he participated again in 2017, winning 5 medals. He has also been a volunteer for many years within a number of organizations serving the English speaking and Jewish communities.

# Penny Rankin, Social Justice Advocate

"Born and bred" in Montreal, Penny began her eclectic career path in the UK where she both trained and worked as a Montessori teacher before spending a number of years in radio with London Broadcasting (LBC) and then as Radio Manager for the advertising firm of Downton Advertising, an affiliate of Saatchi and Saatchi. She also sat on the editorial board and wrote a monthly column for the trade magazine Media World.

Having returned to Canada and to further study and teaching, she volunteered with and has sat on a number of non-profit boards, as well as working two years as the Executive Director of an inner-city mission of the United Church.

An active member of the Anglican Church of Canada, Penny is currently Chair of the Mission Standing Committee of the Diocese of Montreal and is the lead coordinator of an initiative to raise awareness of Human Trafficking, as it manifests in both Montreal and Canada as well as abroad.

As Convenor on Resolutions for the Montreal Council of Women, she has developed resolutions relating to Human Trafficking for submission to the Federal government via the NCWC (National Council).

A mother of three adult children, she lives with her husband on Nun's Island and enjoys travel for both pleasure as well as "voluntouring" (CESO-Canadian Executive Services Overseas).

A self-described Social Justice advocate, her talk entitled: "The Scared, The Scarred and our Sacred Duty-Human Trafficking and Modern Slavery in Canada and Beyond," will provide a broad outline of the issue worldwide with a focus on how Trafficking manifests itself here in Canada.

# **Kim Manning**

A parent, political scientist, and passionate advocate, **Kim Manning** is Principal of the Simone de Beauvoir Institute at Concordia University. Guided by a progressive vision of the possible, Kim has worked to pass new laws in Quebec City and Ottawa on respecting gender identity, has developed new collaborative projects on combating racism and exclusion in education, and frequently contributes to media discussions on feminism and women's and LGBT nomination candidate for the Liberal Party of Canada in the riding of Outremont.
